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OVERVIEW

The City of Ft. Mitchell's summer recreation programs offered 37 different programs in June and July 2015. This included 4 activities for adults, 13 programs for families to enjoy together, 7 activities focused on youth and 13 different camps. The total cost of the program including administrative support, instructors' fee, cost of supplies and facility is \$16,695.58.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Issues to be addressed for next year's summer recreation programming include the following –

- The city needs to move completely towards online registration for ease of administration. Registration by individual day for activities needs to be provided. Automatic reminders one week prior to event should be set up for participants. Also, cut-off dates for events where supplies have to be purchased in advance should be considered.
- 2. A voluteer base needs to be set up in April-May that would include people that can be reached out to assist with events.
- 3. For many of the events parents drop off their children and pickup after. Appropriate sign-in/sign-out forms as well as waivers should be in place to cover thte city of any liability. This could be included as part of the online registration. For events that involve children under the age of 5 or located at the park, adequate assistants are needed to ensure safety.
- 4. A process of requesting reports from instructors should be set up to guage participation and receive feedback on making the program better the following year. Also, a cancellation policy should be in place in case of weather or low participation.
- 5. Supplies are purchased for each event that can be reused the following year. An inventory of supplies should be maintained.
- 6. A determination needs to be made for who is allowed to participate in the City's recreation activities. Can non-residents participate for a higher fee? Are people that do not live here but send their children to a private school located in the City or do business in the city allowed to participate?
- 7. The City should look at the costs and determine if the programming in the future should focus on individualized events or more community events. What is the appropriate cost/person that the City is willing to bear?
- 8. Can or should the City seek sponsorship from local businesses for particular events?
- 9. How can participation be increased at events?
- 10. Should increased partnership with adjacent cities be considered?

A recreation committee should be formed that includes a wide representation from the community to address these issues and make a recommendation to City Council in January 2016.
