CALL TO ORDER / PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE / ROLL CALL

Mayor Jude Hehman, called the council meeting to order at 5:32 p.m.

APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA

Mayor Hehman asked for a motion for approval of the Agenda. Ms. Roeding made a motion to approve the agenda. Mr. Stoeckle seconded the motion. After asking for discussion or questions and hearing none, Mayor Hehman called for a voice vote. The motion carried by all ayes.

APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES

Mayor Hehman asked if there were any other changes to the February 6, 2023 minutes. Hearing none, Ms. Boerger made a motion to approve the February 6, 2023 minutes. Mr. Dietrich seconded the motion. After asking for discussion and hearing none, Mayor Hehman called for a voice vote. The motion passed with all ayes.

PLANNING SESSION

Mr. Stoeckle

• Requested large school zone signs that are up to coded zones including the Requardt, Highland and Pleasant Ridge area. Mr. Tewes stated that this would be a requested from the Kentucky Transportation department.

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Mr. Deatherage

- Add a gateway closer to Fort Wright and an accomplishment banner.
- Evaluate elected officials' salaries compared to surrounding cities.

Dr. Roeding

- Add a City accomplishment banner.
- Widen the green space between Dixie Highway and the sidewalk. Mayor Hehman stated the State will be reconstructing Dixie Highway and sidewalk on one side.
- Continue beautification. Mr. King stated the City will be hanging American flags on Dixie Highway. Mayor Hehman stated that other cities take nominations and sponsorships for veterans' banners. Ms. Boerger stated that the City does not have a bucket truck.
- Add a small piece of sidewalk at the end of the underpass.

Ms. Nachazel

- Build sidewalks.
- Continue focus on Beechwood Road safety.
- Provide education and training for bikes and scooters on sidewalks.
- Evaluate EMS ambulance and staffing when the Drawbridge area development is complete. Mr. King stated the development will have its own ambulatory bay. The calls and EMS staffing will continue to be evaluated.

Mr. Dietrich

 Add a school sign and a ten second arrow on Dixie Highway South turning left onto Highland.

Ms. Boerger

- Publish sidewalk accidents and safety rules on the City's social media and website.
- Develop proactive plan for bridge construction traffic flow.
- Develop beautification plan for the underpass.
- Provide CPR and AED training.

Programs Manager, Mr. Christofield

- Park Board approved new park shelter fees would be \$150 and \$175 Monday through Friday and \$175 and \$200 on Saturday and Sunday for residents and nonresidents to cover shelter rental maintenance.
- The City's Independence Day parade grand marshal will be Noel Rash, the retiring Beechwood High School football coach. The theme will be around anniversaries of large City businesses.
- A second concert will be added on July 29 for \$2,000.
- Shirts will be ordered for City Council members.
- The City will begin holding a business breakfast again.

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Mayor Hehman

- Consider recording our own meeting and not use TBNK.
- Hire a company to provide regular proactive City maintenance for such items as paint, bathrooms, grout and mopping.
- Does Council want to add tangible property taxes? This tax is on business furniture, equipment, and inventory. Vehicles at car dealerships are excluded. Ms. Guenther stated that the Kentucky Constitution and statutes state that City's "shall" charge a tangible property tax. The City collects this tax for Beechwood School District. This would be less than \$100 for most businesses.
- Orphanage-Buttermilk realignment is still on the States project list.

City Administrator, Edwin King

- The City has received \$48,000 from the opioid settlement and will be receiving more.
 Kenton County cities will be pooling funds for the purpose of treatment and counseling.
- The Kentucky Cost of Living Adjustment is 6.5%
- Humana will stop issuing commercial health insurance after the next renewal so the City will need to use a new insurance company after this year.
- The State is requiring a new TIF application to evaluation any changes in the development.

ADJOURNMENT

Ms. Nachazel made a motion to adjourn the meeting at 9:21 p.m. and Mr. Stoeckle seconded the motion. Mayor Hehman called for a voice vote. The motion carried unanimously.
